REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for an officer commission, you must first meet the following requirements:

Be a U.S. citizen

Have a bachelor's degree

Be 18-34 years of age

Be commissioned before age 35

Meet physical requirements

Have a good moral character

Score competitively on the Air Force Officer Qualifying Test

As an applicant, you'll be evaluated for character, academic accomplishments, community service and leadership potential. Selection is competitive and based on your desires, qualifications, degree and the needs of the Air Force.

TOTAL FORCE OFFICER TRAINING

If selected, you'll attend Total Force Officer Training (TFOT) at Maxwell Air Force Base in Montgomery, Alabama. TFOT is a fast-paced, intensive 30 hour pre-arrival, pre-requisite webbased training then an eight-week program that will challenge you both mentally and physically, and prepare you for leadership. But, it's well worth it. The goal of TFOT is to prepare you to lead with vision, honor and integrity.

When you graduate, you'll be commissioned as a second lieutenant with a service commitment and guaranteed job for four years. Most newly commissioned officers attend a technical school after TFOT. The length of schooling depends on your specialty.
